Lighting Upgrade - Dalwallinu Oval

At the Ordinary meeting of Council held on 25 March 2025 Council resolved to support an application to the Club Night Lights Program (CNLP) in the February 2025 round of grant funding. This was to be used for upgrades to the Lighting at Dalwallinu Oval, to be undertaken in the 2025-2026 financial year.

The Shire were notified mid August 2025 that we were successful with our application to upgrade the lighting on Dalwallinu Oval. Subsequently a Request for Tender for works to complete the upgrade was issued and six tenderers were considered. The tender was awarded to NGL Power and works have been successfully undertaken.

The costs was split between three contributors as follows:

Club Night Lights Grant (50% to a max \$200k)	\$ 200,000.00
Contribution from DFHC (24.37%)	\$ 100,514.26
Shire Municipal Funds	\$ 111,936.57
TOTAL:	\$ 412,450.83

The lighting upgrade is a very important project for the oval and will provide significant safety improvement for all oval users. The previous three light towers were not very efficient, only providing limited light for less than half of the oval. This resulted in teams only being able to use part of the oval which made training difficult at times. With these lighting upgrades there are opportunities for the users to run twilight/evening events and this has enhanced the users ability greatly.



CEO Chit Chat



CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER Jean Knight JP

We recently had our first 2026/2027 budget workshop with Councillors and Senior Staff and next year's budget shows no sign of slowing up. Further workshops will be held in the coming weeks with the budget planned for adoption in July 2026.

The Shire of Dalwallinu has been selected to receive a Roadwise Recognised Award at this year's WALGA Awards night to be held on 12 June 2026. Congratulations to Marc Bennett on his efforts with Roadwise initiatives in the Shire.

We were recently successful with an application to have Community Wi-Fi installed through the Strengthening Telecommunications

Against Natural Disasters (STAND) Program. Wi-Fi hardware will be installed at both the Dalwallinu & Kalannie Recreation Centre's in June/July 2026. The Community Wi-Fi is delivered via the NBN Sky Muster Satellite Network.

With the majority of lots from recent subdivisions having been sold in Dalwallinu, we have been in discussions with Government agencies and they are keen to undertake additional residential and industrial subdivisions in Dalwallinu. This will be subject to a successful funding application; however it is great that the State Government is supportive of the concept of additional lots. We will keep you updated throughout the process.

PROJECT UPDATES

- The upgrades at the Dalwallinu Aquatic Centre are continuing. The balance tank upgrade has been completed, and the liner replacement has been delayed until August 2026;
- The upgrade to the lighting on Dalwallinu Oval has been completed. The lighting is a huge improvement from before and the users of the facility are very grateful;

- The two homes at 68 Annetts Rd, Dalwallinu have been handed over to the Shire;
- The two new aged units on Myers Street have been delivered to site. Works will be undertaken to complete the buildings onsite and connect them to services and the Shire will undertake the landscaping in the coming months;
- The shade structure has been completed over the playground on Johnston Street;
- The replacement of the bowling greens will be undertaken in August/Sept 2026.

We have been successful with a funding application to undertake a survey and geotechnical investigation, followed by a civil design of an additional stormwater storage dam south of the existing dam on Roberts Road, Dalwallinu.

Cheap today, costly tomorrow

'Bitumen bandits' and other travelling conmen continue to target households with cheap offers for home maintenance and repairs. From driveway sealing and roof repairs to painting and paving, these operators often arrive uninvited, sometimes claiming they were "working in the area" and have leftover materials they can use at a discounted rate.

While the offer may sound tempting, these deals can quickly turn into an expensive mistake.

Travelling conmen typically pressure consumers into making a quick decision, saying the cheap price is for "today only". They may demand cash payment upfront and even offer to drive people to the bank to withdraw the money, or push consumers into agreeing before they have had time to think it through.

In many cases, the work is left unfinished or completed to a shoddy standard. Once the money has changed hands, the traders are quick to leave town and can be impossible to contact again.

These travelling conmen are breaking the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) by ignoring the required 10-day cooling-off period for unsolicited work. During this time, no payment should be made, and no work is legally permitted. You can also change your mind without penalty.

Western Australians should be cautious of anyone who unexpectedly knocks on the door offering home repair services for cash at too-good-to-be-true prices. Instead, turn them away and let Consumer Protection know so they can track their whereabouts.

If it is safe to do so, try to collect helpful information for investigators, including vehicle registration numbers, the make and model of cars, descriptions or names used by the traders, and copies of any flyers or business cards they provide.

Consumers can also help protect their community by warning neighbours, friends and family members, particularly older relatives who may be more vulnerable to high-pressure sales tactics. Remember word-of-mouth is a powerful tool.

So, if you are looking for someone to do some jobs around the house, take the time to research and ask friends and family for recommendations. Getting multiple written quotes and checking any relevant licences can help avoid costly problems later.

It's worth considering displaying a "Do Not Knock" sticker at your front door, as it can also help deter unwanted sales approaches. A salesperson must leave immediately when asked to by the person who lives in the property – whether it's in-person or via a sticker on the door. Were you separated from your baby through forced adoption?

The Historical Forced Adoptions Redress Scheme provides financial redress and support to the many mothers who continue to live with the serious, complex and ongoing effects of their experience of forced separation.

The scheme offers redress to mothers who gave birth in Victoria, or were a Victorian resident but gave birth interstate, and who were forcibly separated from their newborn babies soon after birth, prior to 1990. Eligible mothers can receive:

- a one-off payment of \$30,000
- access to counselling and support
- apologies or personalised responses in the future and
- a trauma informed, non-court process with support available at every step.

Forced adoption refers to past practices that forcibly separated mothers and their babies. Not all these practices resulted in adoption, and included mothers who were forced, pressured or coerced to give up their babies rather than bear the shame and social stigma of pregnancy and birth outside marriage.

Our support team is available to guide you through the application process, answer questions, and assist you with any supporting information that may be required.

When I attend community events to be present and or to speak to people experiencing challenging times I often heard the word 'Resilience'. Country people are so resilient. But what is the meaning of resilience?



Resilience is often described as having an ability to bounce back after a challenging situation. But Resilience is much more than that.

Resilience is not where we pretend everything is fine, resilience does not mean avoiding emotion, never struggling or being silent about how we feel. Resilience is acknowledging the emotions we are having, feel the pain and still move forward. We make a decision to be hopeful of our future even when the road ahead appears to be a very long and hard one. Experiencing hard challenging times is a part of life everyone experiences at varying levels.

Resilience is not something some of us have and others do not. Resilience when nurtured within and across our community creates a collective strength where people can grow from hard times. People are connected, valued and support each other. We can be that listening ear, offer or set up a welcoming space, be part of a volunteer group, join in a local event and or we can be that person who asks others, 'How are you going RUOK'. Resilience grows where people feel that they are valued and belong, able to use their individual strengths and abilities to assist. Belonging is powerful. When as a community we create safe respectful inclusive spaces, people are better placed to feel OK to reach out early and support each other. Disaster Recovery Hubs are great examples of this.

This does not mean that a resilient community is perfect. We do not agree with everything others do or say in our community, we are all individually different and unique. This uniqueness adds to our community makes it the place it is. Even with differences we enhance resilience when as a community we accept our differences. We agree to disagree, respect each other and acknowledge that every person matters. We don't need to live in each other's pockets, but we do our best to get along with each other.

There are times when emotions are so strong and our ability to reason and cope is challenging. These challenging times can be so strong that we withdraw into ourselves and our thoughts become our reality. It is imperative that in these times we make ourselves vulnerable and ask for help. This takes strength. We maybe feeling that we will burden others, that others don't want to hear our problems and we bottle up our emotions making the emotion stronger. Ask for help, because as part of a resilient caring community you do matter, are valued and people do care about you.

Direct your time, energy, and resources towards things you have direct influence over, rather than things outside of your control (weather/climate, government regulations, commodity markets).



BRING OTHERS TO THE TABLE

Another set of ears and a logical brain can help with processing and retaining information.



KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN

Schedule regular farm business meetings and don't avoid making decisions.



KEEP IN REGULAR CONTACT WITH INDUSTRY PEERS, GROWER GROUPS AND CONSULTANTS

They are sources of trusted and valuable information and can also be a good social connection.



PREPARE AND PLAN FOR THE UNEXPECTED

Contingency planning can avoid further stress.



BE AWARE OF THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH BEHAVIOURS OR COPING STRATEGIES THAT ARE UNSAFE AND PUT YOURSELF AND OTHERS AT RISK

Unsafe alcohol consumption, misuse of prescription medication and use of illicit drugs.



TAKE TIME TO PAUSE, BREATHE AND REFLECT

A simple moment of reflection helps us connect our minds with our feelings. It enables us to connect what's happening around us with what's going on in our heads and hearts. Taking the time to ask the right questions of ourselves, and time to get a thoughtful answer, gives us perspective, direction and clarity. By taking time to pause and slow down our breathing (deep circular breaths), we slow down a racing heart, reducing the symptoms of stress headaches and muscle tension.
