

#### Your crash, their payday? Claims harvesting explained

Picture this – your car has been badly rear-ended in peak hour traffic and you shakily give your personal details to the first tow truck driver on the scene, who takes your car away. A few days later you receive a call from a lawyer who knows all about your car accident and tells you they can "help" you get a significant payout for your minor whiplash.

What you don't know is that tow truck driver was looking to make some extra cash on the side and they sold your personal details to a law firm.

Or maybe you received an unexpected call, email or text asking about a car accident and injuries you may have sustained. How did they know about your bingle from last year? You pass on your details and these are then also sold to a law firm who tries to convince you to use them to make a claim with the Insurance Commission of Western Australia (ICWA).

These are forms of claims harvesting and these people are scammers. They'll often cold-call people hoping to strike it lucky and get someone who has had an accident. They could even pretend to be from the Insurance Commission or other car insurers in an attempt to collect your personal information.

The ICWA has launched a public awareness campaign to warn the community about claim harvesters. Taking advantage of people when they have had a crash, especially when they're injured and vulnerable, is not on. People have reported being harassed, promised large payouts and tricked into making false claims or exaggerating their injuries through certain lawyers. If they do go ahead with the claim they can be left with little or none of the compensation payout after legal fees.

Apart from this misuse of personal information and harassment, the practice costs all Western Australians. It is estimated that 27 per cent of injury insurance claims are made following claims harvesting behaviour. As a result, an estimated \$14 per vehicle in compulsory third-party insurance premium fees paid by all WA vehicle owners is spent on managing harvesting behaviour rather than being spent on medical treatment for those injured in a crash.

A Bill was introduced into WA Parliament to stop the predatory behaviour of claims harvesting. If passed, it will be an offence for anyone to buy, sell or solicit personal details as a motor injury claim referral.

Along with ICWA, Consumer Protection is encouraging the public to beware of this behaviour and if they are contacted about a crash unexpectedly, to hang up and report it to icwa.wa.gov.au.



#### THE ALBANESE LABOR GOVERNMENT STARVES DURACK OF CRUCIAL FUNDS

19 April 2024

The Albanese Government continues to starve regional Australia of much needed economic development funding with its failure to deliver on grants programs promised to the regions. Communities in my electorate of Durack have been left languishing in an economic wilderness for the past two years.

"The Federal Labor Government has imposed a two-year funding drought on regional communities as a result of the Prime Minister's decisions to abolish programs designed to strengthen rural, remote and regional Australia and a failure to deliver initiatives of their own." The Hon Melissa Price MP said.

For more than 40 weeks regional councils and community organisations across Australia have been waiting for the *Growing Regions Program* outcomes and in over nine months not one application has been approved and funded. Local organisations were given just 20 working days to prepare and submit initial applications and the Albanese Government are unable to complete project assessments in 250 days.

Melissa Price MP said "The Albanese Government promised programs to support the regions but after almost two years there is nothing to show for it. Labor Ministers are sitting on grants programs, refusing to part with money promised for the regions, choosing instead to hoard the cash to prop up the budget surplus in Canberra. Many councils are trying to finalise their budgets for the next financial year and do not know if they will be investing in planned projects or have those community infrastructure and economic development initiatives thrown on the scrap heap by the Prime Minister."

The Growing Regions program is not the only grant program that Labor has failed to deliver, with not a single grant approved in the first assessment round of the \$400 million Precincts and Partnerships program, undertaken late last year. During Labor's first two years in office, they have stripped more than \$20 billion in infrastructure and programs from regional communities.

Labor has abolished or allowed to lapse important job and community building programs such as the Building Better Regions Fund, Community Development Grants, Regionalisation Fund, Roads of Strategic Importance Program and the Stronger Communities Program. See below for a complete list of funding rounds that have been disregarded and delayed by the Labor Government.

#### Regional programs abolished or lapsed under Labor:

- Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF) abolished
- Community Development Grants abolished
- Energy Security and Regional Development Plan abolished
- Regional Accelerator Program abolished
- Regionalisation Fund abolished
- Roads of Strategic Importance abolished
- Bridges Renewal Program abolished
- Stronger Communities Program lapsed
- Regional Airports Program lapsed
- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure program lapsed
- Regional Deals program lapsed

Note – 'lapsed' programs are those the Labor Government has chosen not to continue once existing Coalition budget commitments are delivered.

#### In focus – diagnostic photography



Head front and lateral views of an exotic black imported fire ant (*Solenopsis richteri*) worker, focus stacked with a stereomicroscope and dedicated high-resolution digital camera.

Imaging technologies have evolved significantly over the past decade in terms of image resolution, quality, and magnification. It's easy to observe these changes just by looking at the continuous advancements in digital cameras and mobile phones. Less apparent to many is the progress made in macro and micro photography, significantly enhancing the ability to identify invertebrates, fungi, bacteria, and other subjects.

Modern software has evolved too. One such development is a process called 'focus stacking'. Multiple images, focused at different distances are combined, or 'stacked' to form a single, fully focused image. The images featured in this article were produced through focus stacking, making complex diagnostic features easily identifiable.

#### Our subject

The ant photographed is about 3 mm in length. This species is not present in Australia and is of biosecurity concern. To identify this species, diagnosticians (aka taxonomists) need to be able to see its microscopic features, which include a 2-segmented waist and 10-segmented antennae, with the last 2 segments forming a distinct club.

To get a bit more technical, a characteristic seen only among the 2 species of imported fire ant, is the median tooth centred along the front edge of the clypeus, which is flanked by 2 lateral teeth. The clypeus is one of the plates that form the "face" of an insect.

#### The digital advantage

Having digital reference material provides so many advantages. Photographing living specimens prior to curation allows for the full colour spectrum of a species to be captured and permanently recorded. Preserved specimens can lose their colours over time, for example, the eye colour of dragonflies and fruit flies fade shortly after they die.

Diagnostic imaging can facilitate fast-tracked identification as photos may be shared directly with specialists across the globe. This is particularly useful when local experts are not available or further verification is required. Utilising diagnostic photos also reduces the need to send specimens and helps safeguard them from damage and loss.

When communicating about the various pests or diseases that are present in WA or highlighting those to look out for, being able to show them in the environment, and the damage they cause is essential. Our department's imaging specialist helps to do this by creating high-quality digital products. Many of which are available on the Pest and Disease Image Library (padil.gov.au) and are featured on our website and communication products like posters, factsheets, and videos.

If you have taken a photo of something you don't recognise and it's not as flash as the ones featured in this article, don't worry! Please still report it. Photos and the information provided with them help us screen for pests and diseases of biosecurity concern.

## Carbon Farming Survey

#### From PhD student Kashif Khagan

You are invited to participate in a PhD research project (reference no 2023-204) on "Carbon farming: role and implications for broadacre agriculture". As a part of this research, an online survey is being conducted to gauge farmer's perceptions of carbon farming. The Ararat Rural City Council funds this research, and the PhD candidate is supported by Federation University Australia and Destination Australia Scholarship. Supervisors include Prof. Harpinder Sandhu (principal supervisor), Dr. Benedikt Fest (Associate supervisor), and Dr Tim Harrison (Industry supervisor).

This study aims to understand farmers' perceptions about carbon farming. It will also help identify various barriers and opportunities for adopting carbon farming.

The responses will be anonymous and confidential. The survey questions will cover some demographic attributes, farm characteristics, and the opinions and perceptions of the farmers about the adoption of carbon farming and its potential co-benefits. It will also include the perception of prospective challenges and opportunities for adopting carbon farming. The collected data will be analysed using quantitative methods. There will be no individually identifiable information, remarks, comments, or other identification of you as an individual participant in the disseminated results of the study. All results will be presented as aggregate summary data.

Agreeing to participate in and completing the survey implies that you consent to include your response in the data analysis. Participation in this research study is strictly voluntary, and you may choose not to participate without fear of penalty or any negative consequences. You can withdraw from the survey anytime, and all the survey responses, including the informed consent, will be deleted. You may choose not to answer survey questions you wish to avoid answering. If consent is withdrawn after data has been aggregated and processed, it is impossible to remove non-identifiable data, although consent can still be removed.

Any data we obtain from you will be managed to ensure, as far as possible, your privacy and anonymity. All data will be stored securely (de-identified and password protected) by the researchers on this project and will adhere to human research ethics protocols. The collected data will be used for thesis reports and journal articles and may also be disseminated at conferences. Please be aware that your de-identified data may be used to inform future research. Data will be destroyed after five years.

There is no direct compensation for participating in this study. However, your participation will be a valuable addition to the survey. The researchers on this project have extensive experience in social research in agriculture, farm assessments, environment, and community. They look forward to your responses if you participate in this research project.

## RED Grant to boost production of modular housing in the Wheatbelt

Regional Development Minister Don Punch has today celebrated the official opening of an all-weather production facility at award-winning modular and prefabricated home builder Evoke Living Homes in Northam.

Regional Development Minister Don Punch has today celebrated the official opening of an all-weather production facility at award-winning modular and prefabricated home builder Evoke Living Homes in Northam.

The facility was supported by a \$200,000 grant through the Regional Economic Development (RED) Grant program in 2021.

Completion of the 2,000 square metre undercover facility enables Evoke Living Homes to reduce construction delays and increase production by 20 per cent, translating to an additional 8-10 new homes built per year in the region.

The builder has also taken on six new trades and two apprentices to support the increase in production capacity, which will see the business scale into new markets.

During his trip to Northam, Minister Punch also visited another REDs project site at the Avon Industrial Park, where Tradesales are constructing a new commercial office. He also toured the Mortlock Gardens key worker housing precinct and met with the Shire of Northam to discuss the town's growth priorities.





#### Find Cancer Early: Tips when visiting your doctor about a possible symptom!

As we get older, many of us don't often think too much about a change to our body. This can result in us expecting and accepting changes over time as being normal.

But it is important to not be tempted to put something unusual down to 'getting older' before you've told your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. Always have a chat and let them know what you've noticed, even if you're not concerned by it. Chances are it is nothing to worry about, but it's better to be on the safe side.

When you decide to make an appointment, lots of different questions and concerns can pass through your mind, such as:

- The doctor is always too busy.
- It's too hard to get an appointment.
- When I get to my appointment my mind goes blank.
- What could happen when I see the doctor or health worker?
- I don't have a doctor.
- I feel embarrassed or shame.

#### Tips when you are visiting your doctor/health professional

- Be clear about your symptoms.
- Calling early in the morning is often the best time to arrange an appointment.
- If your usual health professional isn't available that day, ask
   for an appointment in a few days time, or ask to see another doctor.
- If you feel you need to speak to a health professional straight away, tell the receptionist it is urgent when you call.
- Write down why you've made the appointment and what you want to tell your health professional.
- Keep a symptom diary of what's been happening, how long for, and how often it occurs – you can take this with you.
- Health professionals are there to help you don't be embarrassed to let them know about any unusual changes you've noticed in your body.
- Take someone with you as a second pair of ears to listen & perhaps to take notes for you to clarify what is said at your appointment.

#### Become familiar with common cancer symptoms

We encourage adults, especially those over 40 years of age, to be aware of some common symptoms of cancers. You can give yourself the best chance to **Find Cancer Early**, by going to see a doctor straight away if you have symptoms, so that treatment is easier, and you can be around longer to do the things you love doing with the people you love.
