work together to enable Council to complete all their annual targets. So, thank you to all of the team.

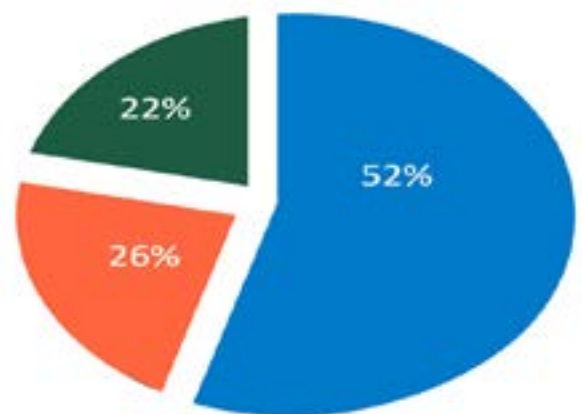
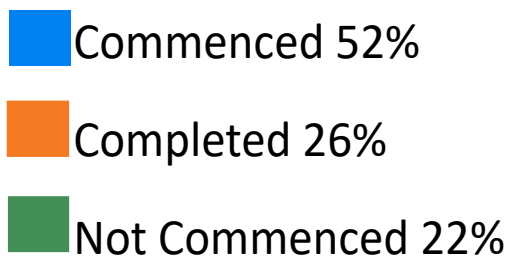
On behalf of Council I would like to wish Cr Jemma Counsel a speedy recovery from her recent surgery. We hope to see her fully recovered soon.

### A brief Summary of...

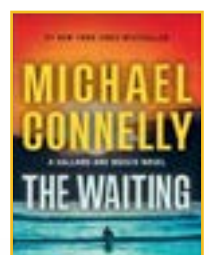
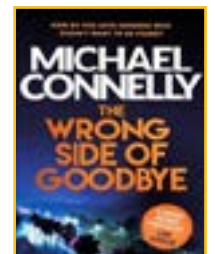
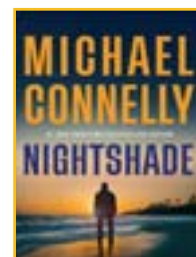
Michael Connelly - is an American author of detective novels and other crime fiction.

Connelly is the bestselling author of 38 novels and one work of non-fiction, with over 74 million copies of his books sold worldwide and translated into 40 languages.

After graduating from the University of Florida in 1980, Connelly got a job as a crime beat writer at the Daytona Beach News-Journal, where he worked for almost two years.

Connelly describes his work as a big canvas with all the characters of his books floating across it as currents on a painting. Sometimes they are bound to collide, creating cross currents.

This is something that Connelly creates by bringing back characters from previous books and letting them play a part in books written five or six years after first being introduced.

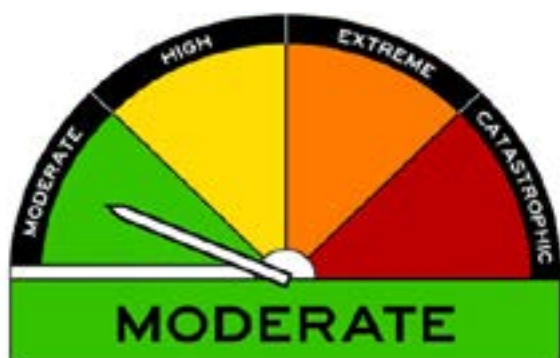

## Public Health - Septic Tank Tips

### Do's for Maintaining your Septic Tank: The Best Tips

Let's look at all the easy tips you should be doing to avoid costly repairs and keep the overall system working as efficiently as possible.

- Schedule regular maintenance. You should pump out the solid waste in your septic tank every 3-5 years.
- Conserve water. Repair water leaks and use low-flow water-saving devices on every faucet, shower head, and toilet in the house! Monitoring your water usage is one of the best ways to help keep your system running smoothly.
- Protect and inspect the drain field. Have it inspected whenever you have the septic system pumped or cleaned.
- Use septic-approved products. Look for cleaning products and toilet paper that state they are safe for septic systems. You can use septic tank additives if you like, but the truth is that we aren't convinced that they work. They don't cause harm, so you can use them if you like.
- Teach everyone in your household about the septic system. Go over the list of Don'ts with everyone in your house to avoid problems.
- Run only full loads when using washing machines or a dishwasher. Water conservation matters!
- Do your laundry over several days, not in one go. Limit yourself to no more than 3 full loads of laundry per day.
- Make sure that your septic tank is the right size for your household. Expand or replace your septic tank with a larger or better design if your family has grown substantially.
- Limit the food scraps that get into the sink. Scrape plates into the garbage first or start a compost bin.



### Don'ts for Septic Tank Care: Common Mistakes to Avoid

These are some common mistakes most people make with their septic system.

- Don't flush products not approved for septic tanks. Toilet paper, cigarette butts, feminine hygiene products, disposable diapers, baby wipes, sanitary products, dental floss, paper towels, and other products that are not biodegradable should never be put in your septic system.
- Don't ignore unusual activity. Gurgling drains, slow drains, dirty-looking water in the toilet, bad smells from drains, or soggy soil around the leach drain field are all warning signs that the septic tank is full of solid waste and needs to be pumped.
- Don't pour harsh chemicals, bleaching agents, drain cleaners, or grease down the drain. As you would expect, grease clogs pipes, and harsh chemicals kill the good bacteria that allow your system to work as it should.
- Don't dump even biodegradable items down the drain. While coffee grounds, food scraps, and other biodegradable matters are natural, they tend to be problematic. Use a composting bin or throw them out in the trash.
- Don't plant trees with invasive roots on or around the drain field. If you aren't sure which trees are safe to plant, you can call the friendly staff at Superior Septics.
- Don't use dishwashers or washing machines during heavy rains. Rainfall is already saturating the drain field. Adding extra water from these devices puts a heavy strain on the soil.
- Don't overload your septic tank. Avoid running the dishwasher, washing machine, shower, and toilet simultaneously because this huge amount of water will overburden the irrigation field. Consider running the dishwasher today and the washing machine tomorrow.
- Avoid overusing antibacterial products. Soap is naturally antibacterial so there is no need to use antibacterial soaps. Excessive use of this item can disrupt the natural, friendly bacteria that your septic system thrives on. Look for eco-friendly soaps or go with old-fashioned bar soaps that are environmentally and septic system friendly.

### **One ride can change everything**

Quad bikes are not toys and along with the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC), Consumer Protection is encouraging farmers, partners, parents and carers to protect their loved ones when riding these powerful machines.

Ahead of the summer holidays the ACCC has launched the 'One ride can change everything' safety awareness campaign. Although some quad accidents will be relatively minor, others can have devastating, lifelong consequences for the rider and their families.

Since 2011, 235 Australians have died in quad bike incidents, with men accounting for more than 80% of fatalities, figures from [SafeWork Australia](http://SafeWorkAustralia.gov.au) show. Twenty-three of those deaths occurred in Western Australia, with two of them being children aged under 10. In fact, Australia-wide children under-16 make up more than a quarter of all emergency department presentations relating to quad bike injuries.

You should never let kids ride quads made for adults, even as passengers. When they ride an adult-sized quad bike they are often over-confident in their ability to control the bike. Children also don't have the skills or physical strength to handle the power of these bikes and it can have catastrophic outcomes.

Despite being marketed as "all-terrain vehicles", quad bikes cannot safely go anywhere and everywhere. Steep slopes or rough terrain increases the risk of a roll over. Even at slower speeds, these bikes can topple over and crush or suffocate the rider with the hundreds of kilos these machines weigh.

Side-by-sides are another all-terrain vehicle growing in popularity and unfortunately this means so are the incidents. Many fatalities and serious injuries occur when occupants don't use or remove safety features from their vehicles such as seatbelts, doors or netting. Coroner inquiries into fatalities involving side-by-sides have found that if victims had been wearing seatbelts at the time of the accident, they would not have been thrown from the cabin.

There are three golden rules to follow when using quad bikes to help you, your loved ones, friends and work colleagues stay safe. Always wear a helmet, but make sure it's the right fit, and done up firmly. Adult-sized helmets don't protect child-sized heads, and no helmet works if it's left in the shed.

Make sure your quad bike is fitted with rollover protection, also called an operator protection device (OPD). If the quad topples over it will be held off the ground to provide a crawl out space. Finally, children under the age of 16 should never ride an adult quad bike, even when an adult is present.

When it comes to side-by-sides, always wear a seat belt and never let children drive. It's also worth checking the manufacturer's advice before letting children ride side-by-side vehicles as passengers.

### The WA Christmas tree, stealing the show (and water!)

Christmas is just around the corner, and that means the glorious Western Australian Christmas tree, or moodjar in Noongar (*Nuytsia floribunda*), are in bloom! Not only are they our state's most iconic summer-flowering tree, but they're one of the botanical world's most fascinating survivalists!

#### A tree like no other

The WA Christmas tree is found exclusively in the south-west corner of Western Australia, from Geraldton to Esperance. Growing up to 10 meters tall, it's a member of the mistletoe family (Loranthaceae) and holds the remarkable distinction of being the world's largest hemiparasitic plant. From late November through January, these trees put on a stunning display, with masses of vibrant orange-yellow flowers that can be spotted from a distance across the landscape.

However, the real show happens underground. The Christmas tree's roots can send out specialised structures called haustoria that seek

out and tap into the roots of neighbouring plants, stealing their water and nutrients. They are indiscriminate in their parasitism, grasses, shrubs, even other trees become unwilling hosts. There are stories of road crews encountering Christmas trees trying to parasitise underground cables, with their root attachments causing significant damage!

Despite this vampiric lifestyle, the Christmas tree produces its own leaves and photosynthesises like any normal tree. Meaning it is a hemiparasite (only partially parasitic). These parasitic adaptations allow it to access water during WA's notoriously dry summers, and extract nutrients, in an environment of nutrient-poor, sandy soils that dominate the region.

So these holidays, why not jump in the car, or go for a bushwalk and see if you can spot some of these incredible plants found nowhere else in the world.

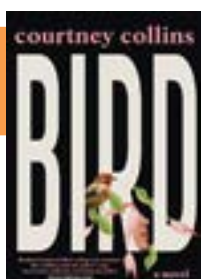


#### **A Woman in Sardinia**

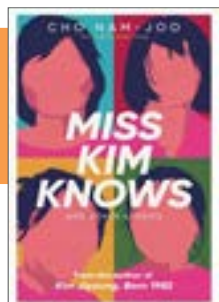
#### **Lola in the Mirror**

domestic violence. A woman is gas lit. A woman is discriminated against at work. A woman grows old. A woman becomes famous. A woman is hated, and loved, and then hated again. Written in Cho Nam-Joo's masterful, razor-sharp prose, *Miss Kim Knows* brings together the lives of eight Korean women, aged 10 to 80. Contained in each of these biographies is a microcosm of contemporary Korea, and the challenges and injustices that women face from childhood to old age. As with Kim Jiyoung, *Born 1982*, the fates of these eight women are the fates of women the world over. And under Cho Nam-Joo's precise, unveiled gaze, nothing and nobody escapes scrutiny – not even herself.

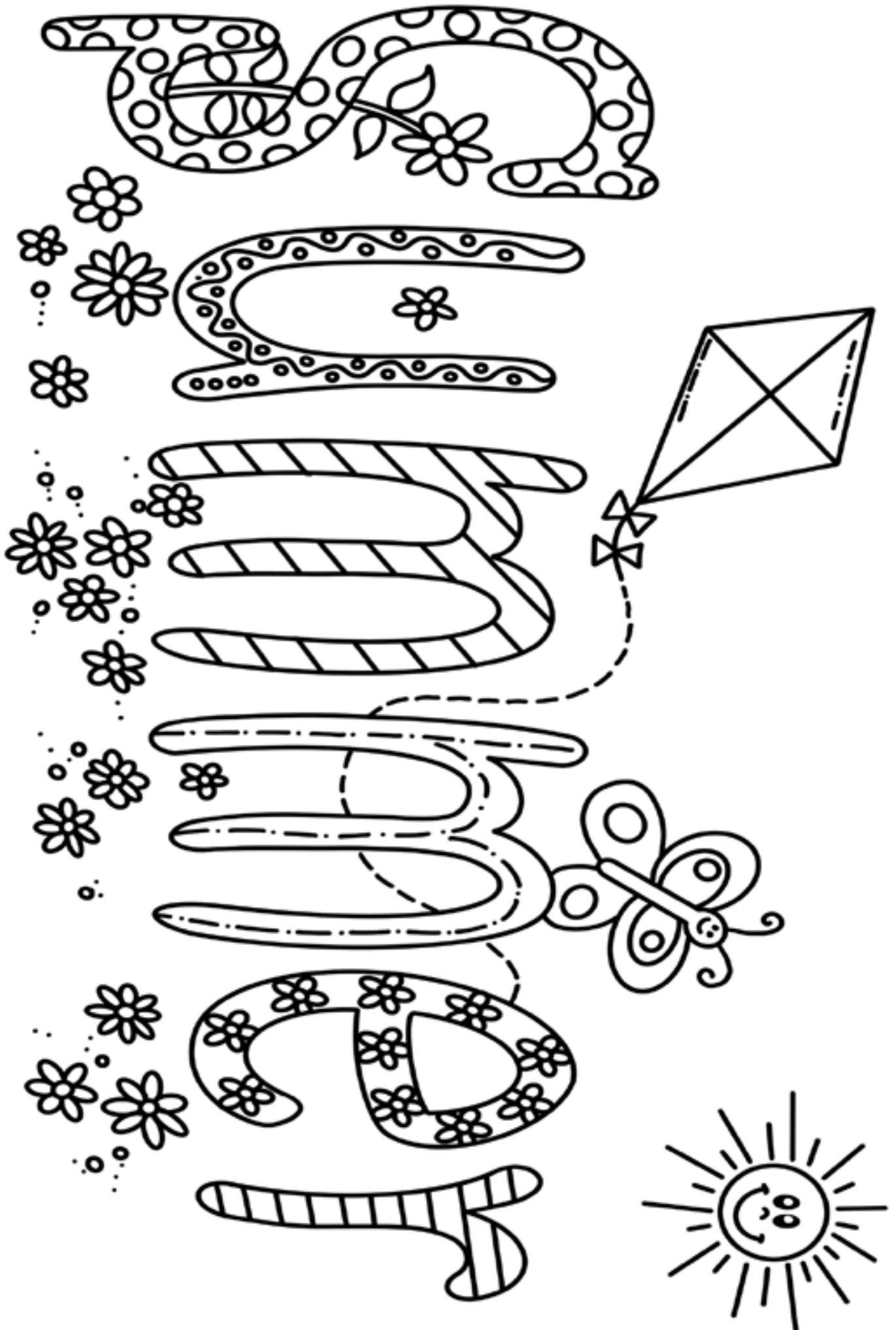

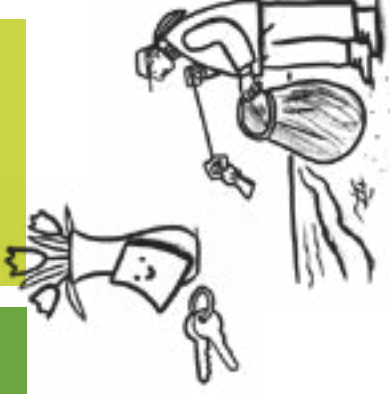

## Wheatbelt farmer becomes face of Christmas Appeal to support country cancer patients

Wheatbelt farmer, Gerard Hodges, is the face of Cancer Council WA's 2025 Christmas Appeal after a shock skin cancer diagnosis turned his life upside down.

The fit and healthy farmer first noticed what looked like a simple graze on his hand during the 2022 harvest season.

"Bumps and grazes aren't unusual for farmers, so I shrugged it off," Gerard said. "But it just didn't heal. One bandage turned into three."



When the Royal Flying Doctor Service came through town, Gerard had it checked. What was first thought to be a minor basal cell carcinoma turned out to be Stage 4 squamous cell carcinoma, an aggressive form of skin cancer that had already spread to his kidney and liver. Within days, Gerard was in Perth, unsure where he would stay or how long he would be away from the farm. After weeks in ICU fighting pneumonia, organ failure, and even surviving two cardiac arrests, he was told about Cancer Council WA's accommodation Lodges.

Since moving into Milroy Lodge in Shenton Park, Gerard has found more than just a place to stay, he has found peace in the gardens, comfort in the 24-hour support, and connection with others who understand what he is going through.

"I'm so proud to be the face of this year's Christmas Appeal," Gerard said.

"I encourage the WA community to get behind it and support this vital accommodation service for regional people like me."

This year alone the lodges have had almost 5,000 check-ins from country patients and carers. By donating to our Christmas Appeal, you're ensuring country cancer patients like Gerard have vital support when they need it most.

### Progression Planning (Succession) Relationships First

Progression Planning is about retaining family relationships in the progression/succession process by looking at the *people issues* before dealing with the financial and business aspects. It is often the unspoken expectations of family members that can lead to the difficulties experienced. If farming families looked at the relationship aspects and the *people issues*, of their business as part of the progression plan there would be less stress and misunderstanding.

Why Progression? Mixed messages are received and given using the word *succession*. For most it means the *king is dead* who is the next king? Progression is not just a business transaction; it is primarily about *relationships*. One of the greatest risks to a farming family's viability, in the long term, is relationship breakdown that we often don't see coming. Progression shifts the focus to how we move the family-owned business into the next era or generation and how the older generation can successfully make the transition to the next phase of their lives. *Progression* encapsulates these options.



Effective communication allows for awareness, understanding and a basis to reach agreement on issues. Communication must be maintained to both reduce distress and for our positive wellbeing. In fact, many people don't talk about progression until it's too late and/or put it off because it is too difficult.

The following key topics in progression planning need to be canvassed in detail:

- Family communication, it all starts here.
- What is the farm business? Allows understanding of the business the family are involved in.
- Stakeholders, who's involved? It is important to empower all parties to have a role in the progression planning process.
- What do stakeholders want? Questions to ask our spouse/partner and children about progression and/or retirement and business development.
- Transition period. You must establish an agreement that is suitable to your requirements. It's not going to happen overnight.

We need to make Progression Planning discussions part of normal conversation in our business. Only the minority, amongst family-owned businesses, have any documentation around farm and/or business succession. Families must lead the way and own the process, no one can do it for us. Some simple rules that influence good progression planning are:

- Sort the relationships first.
- Debate the issues openly and with those that matter.
- Start planning early, when your kids leave school, the plan should be in place and understood.
- When children come to work on the farm and/or in the business, be clear on where it is going (sell the business not the land or building).
- Seek outside help for more than financial and legal matters (involve more than just the farm consultant, accountant and/or lawyer).
- Have a handover strategy and stick to it.

Remember not all businesses will be able to have a successful progression/succession outcome, for a variety of reasons. Maintain those relationships first, to give it the best shot. A quote from Warren Buffett that fits in well with progression/succession matters... *Don't do what others say, just listen to them, and do what you feel good with.*

### KEEP THE LINES OF COMMUNICATION OPEN

Schedule regular farm business meetings and don't avoid making decisions.



### KEEP IN REGULAR CONTACT WITH INDUSTRY PEERS, GROWER GROUPS AND CONSULTANTS

They are sources of trusted and valuable information and can also be a good social connection.



### PREPARE AND PLAN FOR THE UNEXPECTED

Contingency planning can avoid further stress.



### BE AWARE OF THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH BEHAVIOURS OR COPING STRATEGIES THAT ARE UNSAFE AND PUT YOURSELF AND OTHERS AT RISK

Unsafe alcohol consumption, misuse of prescription medication and use of illicit drugs.



### TAKE TIME TO PAUSE, BREATHE AND REFLECT

A simple moment of reflection helps us connect our minds with our feelings. It enables us to connect what's happening around us with what's going on in our heads and hearts. Taking the time to ask the right questions of ourselves, and time to get a thoughtful answer, gives us perspective, direction and clarity. By taking time to pause and slow down our breathing (deep circular breaths), we slow down a racing heart, reducing the symptoms of stress headaches and muscle tension.
