
AIC: Basic (non means tested) \$9960.00

Additional (means tested) \$ \$2,586.00

BAHA: \$1389.00

ICPA is continually advocating for these allowances to be reviewed and increased.



MAY 2024 Hockey Pavilion Official Opening

Shire President Keith Carter will officially open the Dalwallinu Hockey Pavilion at the Dalwallinu Recreation Precinct on Sunday 5 May 2024.

This facility was funded as follows:

- Department of Sport and Recreation CSRFF Grant \$108,868
- Dalwallinu Football & Hockey Club (DFHC) \$100,000
- Shire of Dalwallinu \$204,257

The facility provides for home and away external seating areas, showers, toilets and a viewing room with kitchenette.

Many thanks go to Kyle McLaughlin from Building Base for the contruction of the facility in a professional and timely manner and to Marc Bennett for supervising the construction. This building is a great addition to the Dalwallinu Recreation Centre.

This building will be leased by the DFHC for their hockey season and will be available to the community for hire during the off season.


Project Updates

 The installation of the six (6) water tanks (3 in Dalwallinu and 3 in Kalannie) has been completed. We are just awaiting some plumbing works to finish off the project. Many thanks to the Department of Water & Environment Regulation for providing funding of \$137,138 through the Country Water Supply Program, as without this contribution, the project would not have been possible.

- Delivery of the equipment for the playgrounds in Wubin & Dalwallinu is expected in the coming days.
- The Hockey Pavilion project is completed and handover of the building was on 26 April 2024.
- The Executive Residence in Bell Street has been completed with handover on 16 April 2024. Landscaping has commenced and will be completed in the coming weeks.

STRAWBERRY MINI MUFFINS



Traffic light category: Amber Serves: 24

Ingredients

- ½ cup polyunsaturated margarine
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup reduced fat strawberry yoghurt
- 1 large punnet strawberries, chopped
- Grated rind and juice of 1 large lemon
- 1 ½ cups self raising flour, sifted
- 1 cup wholemeal self raising flour, sifted

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C and grease or line a mini muffin tray
- 2. Blend the margarine and sugar in a bowl
- 3. Beat in the eggs and yoghurt
- 4. Fold in the chopped strawberries, lemon juice and rind
- 5. Very carefully fold in the flour to avoid squashing the strawberries
- 6. Place in muffin tray and bake for 15-20 minutes.

Other fresh berries such as raspberries, boysenberries or blackberries could be substituted for strawberries. If using frozen berries add after step four and avoid over mixing.
