What is the ICPA?

The Isolated Parents and Children's Association (ICPA) is a parent based organisation whose purpose is to advocate for equity in education for rural, remote and regional students at all stages of their education, from early childhood, primary, secondary and tertiary studies. We are the Central Wheatbelt North (CWN) branch of the ICPA.

Please consider becoming a member of CWN branch of ICPA. An annual membership is \$103.00, to join please visit: icpa.com.au/wa and look for the membership link and CWN branch. ICPA's ability to influence government policy is only as strong as its membership base.

Why Join?

Lobbying by the ICPA was instrumental in the dental van returning to Kalannie Primary School.

ICPA has successfully negotiated an increase in the school bus conveyancing allowance.

Allowances such as the Assistance for Isolated Children's Scheme (AIC) and Boarding Away From Home Allowance (BAHA) assists parents with the costs of sending their children to boarding school where no suitable or geographical alternative exists. The current allowances are:

AIC: Basic (non means tested) \$9960.00

Additional (means tested) \$ \$2,586.00

BAHA: \$1389.00

ICPA is continually advocating for these allowances to be reviewed and increased.

Hockey Pavilion Official Opening

This facility was funded as follows:

- Department of Sport and Recreation CSRFF Grant - \$108,868
- Dalwallinu Football & Hockey Club (DFHC) - \$100,000
- Shire of Dalwallinu - \$204,257

The facility provides for home and away external seating areas, showers, toilets and a viewing room with kitchenette.

Many thanks go to Kyle McLaughlin from Building Base for the construction of the facility in a professional and timely manner and to Marc Bennett for supervising the construction. This building is a great addition to the Dalwallinu Recreation Centre.

This building will be leased by the DFHC for their hockey season and will be available to the community for hire during the off season.

Project Updates

- The installation of the six (6) water tanks (3 in Dalwallinu and 3 in Kalannie) has been completed. We are just awaiting

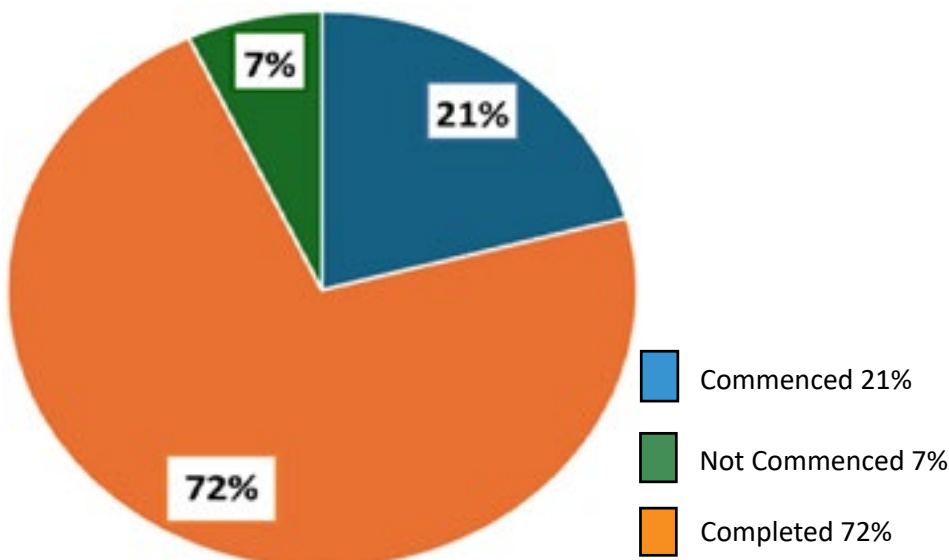
some plumbing works to finish off the project. Many thanks to the Department of Water & Environment Regulation for providing funding of \$137,138 through the Country Water Supply Program, as without this contribution, the project would not have been possible.

- Delivery of the equipment for the playgrounds in Wubin & Dalwallinu is expected in the coming days.
- The Hockey Pavilion project is completed and handover of the building was on 26 April 2024.
- The Executive Residence in Bell Street has been completed with handover on 16 April 2024. Landscaping has commenced and will be completed in the coming weeks.

We are currently looking for a Plant Operator, a General Hand and a Part-Time Cleaner. If you are interested, please contact the Shire Admin Office.

We have received an update from DevelopmentWA regarding the two new subdivisions in Dalwallinu. The Civil Works contract has been awarded. They hope to commence the residential subdivision shortly. This will take approx. 14 weeks and they will then commence the industrial subdivision which will take approximately 18 weeks. DevelopmentWA will commence

STRAWBERRY MINI MUFFINS



Traffic light category: **Amber**

Serves: 24

Ingredients

- ½ cup polyunsaturated margarine
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup reduced fat strawberry yoghurt
- 1 large punnet strawberries, chopped
- Grated rind and juice of 1 large lemon
- 1 ½ cups self raising flour, sifted
- 1 cup wholemeal self raising flour, sifted

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C and grease or line a mini muffin tray
2. Blend the margarine and sugar in a bowl
3. Beat in the eggs and yoghurt
4. Fold in the chopped strawberries, lemon juice and rind
5. Very carefully fold in the flour to avoid squashing the strawberries
6. Place in muffin tray and bake for 15-20 minutes.

Other fresh berries such as raspberries, boysenberries or blackberries could be substituted for strawberries. If using frozen berries add after step four and avoid over mixing.
